

Certificate in Palliative Care - Program Outline

The Certificate in Palliative Care program provides an opportunity to develop knowledge and skill in end of life care and is suitable for Health Care Assistants, other health professionals or other persons involved in providing end of life care. This course will guide students to a better understanding of how to apply principles of palliative and end-of-life care to clients and their families experiencing life-threatening illness with an integrative approach, from diagnosis to the last hours of life and through to death, grief and bereavement. Students will learn how to provide care that is culturally relevant and honors the choices, traditions, and values of the dying person and their family.



Length/Structure

30 hours. This course is comprised of theory and hands-on lab practice and is offered on campus over four consecutive days or once weekly x 4 weeks.



Part A: General Admission Requirements			
2.	18 years of age or older		
3.	Meet minimum English language proficiency requirements (described below)		
Part B: English Proficiency Requirements - Submit evidence of one of the following;			
	Successful completion of grade 10, 11, or 12 English or Communications 12 or higher level English course undertaken at a recognized Canadian Secondary or Post-Secondary Educational Institutionor;		
2.	Successful completion of the SECC English Language Proficiency Assessment Testor;		
3.	 Evidence of one of the following test scores; The Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) test must be within the last two years. IBT only: Overall score of 64 with no score lower than 17 in Speaking and Listening and no score lower than 15 in Reading and Writing or; International English Language Testing System (IELTS) Academic test must be within the last two years: Overall score of 5.5 with a minimum of 5.5 in Speaking and Listening and no score lower than 5.0 in Reading and Writing or; Canadian Language Benchmark Placement Test (CLB PT) test must be within the last six months: Listening6, Speaking 6, Reading 5 and Writing 5 or; Canadian English Language Proficiency Index Program (CELPIP) Academic Test version: Aggregate score of 3H or better, with 3H or better in Speaking and Listening and 3L or better in Reading and Writing.
